## **Activity Progression**

One of my personal favorite activities of the year is putting my students with and without disabilities into teams and letting them explore a corner of our school campus to take videos and pictures and progress through the challenges. While you may have a better way to progress through each challenge (maybe you have technology), this is what I have on my clip board that day that allows them to break down barriers of communication and anxiety on the first day of the term.

- Split students into teams of 4.
- Start each team on a different challenge.
- They must take a picture and report back to the teacher with evidence (the photo or video). Then check off their team for that challenge and move them to the next one below the one they just finished.
- Continue until they finish all photo challenges and/or class runs out.

OPTIONAL: Create a Google slide show where they can submit their favorite videos and pics and show it at the end of the term.

You will notice that this activity allows students to get to know each other immediately and work through social and emotional challenges.



Note: These are some of the challenges that I use, but feel free to create your own that more directly is tied to your school!

## **Modifications/Differentiations**

- Allow students to come up with additional challenges.
- Give them a time limit or allow this to be completed over a few class periods.
- Have the class create an established set of rules or norms for the scavenger hunt.

## **Checks for Understanding/Assessment Strategies**

- What were some of the challenges your group faced?
- How did you work through those challenges?
- Did you learn anything new about you, your teammates, or about your school?
